With surveys of alumni, a decision has been made to pursue the addition of a Doctorate in Strategic Leadership at Evangel University in the College of Adult and Graduate studies. There will be one track or concentration at this time: Strategic Foresight. We examined schools in a 250-300 mile radius and sister Assemblies of God colleges across the country and determined the opportunity exists for us to offer this degree.

What drives the proposal to add or change this program? We have upwards of 60-70 inquiries about a doctorate in leadership from General Council and interest surveys.
