The Education Specialist and Doctorate programs have overlapping courses, so students can be pursuing different degrees while in the same course. As EdS students are finishing, a new cohort will begin, so there will be two cohorts in year three. Lindenwood was asked to attend an informational meeting in April at Sedalia High School. The employees and superintendent requested the program be offered after a student needs assessment.

Potential students and superintendents have contacted Lindenwood's site coordinator about offering a program in Sedalia. Discussion with administrators and faculty in the Sedalia School District and at State Fair College supported the need for an EdD program in the area.

1. Student Preparation

Our instructors will have the required academic requirements, as well as provide evidence of being experienced and successful in educational leadership.

3. Enrollment Projections

- Student FTE majoring in program by the end of five years. We anticipate 100% part time enrollment throughout the program.

4. Student and Program Outcomes

- Number of graduates per annum at three and five years after implementation. We anticipate five to ten graduates three years after implementation, depending on how many students choose the EdD over the EdS. Five years after implementation, we anticipate about 15 graduates per year.
- Special skills specific to the program.
 Students are seeking higher degree to become a school district superintendent. Students must successfully complete a degree program and pass certification assessments to be recommended for certification per MoDESE requirements.
- Proportion of students who will achieve licensing, certification, or registration.

 All students who complete the Educational Administration degree will be prepared for certification assessments.

 We expect to meet the APR requirements of 80% of our students will pass the DESE
 - We expect to meet the APR requirements of 80% of our students will pass the DESE certification assessments by the second attempt.

 We do not anticipate students transferring from the program because there are not currently available competitive programs in the area.

5. Program Accreditation

Lindenwood University is accredited through the Higher Learning Commission. The Lindenwood University School of Education programs are accredited through the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. The initial teacher certification program is accredited through the national Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) through the national Teacher Education Accreditation Council (TEAC) legacy pathway. Currently CAEP is finalizing national advanced education standards and Lindenwood University School of Education will pursue this certification when it is available.

6. Alumni and Employer Survey

- Expected satisfaction rates for alumni, *including timing and method of surveys*. 100% satisfaction rate. Faculty are evaluated each semester by students and the extended site coordinator who is a full-time faculty member.
- Expected satisfaction rates for employers, including timing and method of surveys. Because school districts specifically ask Lindenwood to work with their faculty, and they continue with multiple cohorts, we anticipate a 100% satisfaction rate.

Several sites across Missouri already offer these programs through Lindenwood University and have been successful. Currently, any Sedalia area educators interested in these sorts of programs must travel/commute at least an hour to another university, and some of these higher education institutions do not offer the same programs.
