





#### SB 68 – Fast Track

- Statutory Authority § § 173.2553-.2554
- Creates Fast Track program
- DHEWD staff are
  - Finalizing rulemaking;
  - Reviewing applications and making awards; and
  - Educating stakeholders on the program.



#### **HB 604 – School Turnaround Act**

- Statutory Authority § 160.545, RSMo.
- Modifies A+ provisions
- DHEWD staff:
  - Filed rulemaking with SOS for the parts that we can implement;
  - Requested funding in budget request; and
  - Are working with stakeholders to identify implementation plans for the dual credit portion of the legislation.



# SB 306 – Military Families

- SB 306 Military Families
  - Veteran's Survivor Grant § 173.234
  - Returning Heroes Act § 173.900
  - Military Dependents In-State Tuition § 173.1155
- Changes do not require DHEWD staff action.
- DHEWD staff have updated online guidance and are assisting schools as questions arise.

# Background

- Statutory responsibility of CBHE to designate eligible programs
- June 2019 CBHE designated initial list of eligible program areas
- Initial list basis
  - Long-term occupational projections on state and regional level
  - Developed list of in-demand occupations
  - Crosswalked identified occupations with instructional program classification system (CIP)
- Initial program participation restricted to STEM, STEM-related, teacher education and agriculture



# **Change Process**

# Background

- CBHE has the statutory responsibility to recommend funding for higher education facilities at Missouri's public institutions
- September 2019: CBHE asked department staff to review the guidelines and consider possible modifications
- Department staff surveyed public institution presidents/chancellors, CFOs, facility directors, and General Assembly staff members on the guidelines and ranking process
- Results of survey provided during the December 2019 CBHE meeting



# **Proposed Revisions**

- Board members were provided items reflecting the department's recommended changes to the current guidelines
- Substantive changes include:
  - The board's practice of considering significant renovations above and beyond ordinary maintenance and repair is included
  - The board will provide the Governor and General Assembly with two separate lists: One for renovation of existing space and one for new construction
  - Department staff will score each institution's top priority in both categories



# Substantive changes (cont.)

- Requests for funding to renovate space should generally not exceed 10 percent of the institution's core operating appropriation
   (This recommended change requires discussion)
- Workforce needs will be considered
- Renovations that improve ADA compliance are listed as a consideration in factor 2 rather than as a standalone factor
- Renovations that result in utility savings will be prioritized
- The board will consider recommending funds for construction before funds for planning when an institution demonstrates that it has already completed planning


