

MISSOURI REVERSE TRANSFER

seamless associate degree completion

The Missouri Reverse Transfer Program allows individuals to use college credit earned at two- and four-year higher education institutions to qualify for an associate degree.

Students who have completed at least 15 credit hours at a qualifying two-year college and transferred to a four-year college or university in Missouri can transfer credit hours back to the two-year college to earn an associate degree. Individuals who are not currently attending college but who have earned enough credits at a two- and a four-year institution could qualify for a reverse transfer degree.

What are the benefits?

The Missouri Reverse Transfer Program provides students with an opportunity to earn an associate degree while pursuing their bachelor's degree. An associate degree can open the door to more job opportunities and higher pay. It also can fulfill the general education requirements when transferring to a four-year college or university.

Who is eligible?

Individuals must have earned a minimum of 15 transferable credit hours at a single twoyear institution to be eligible for a reverse transfer degree. Those who have already received an associate degree or higher are not eligible for a reverse transfer degree.

How do you participate?

Applying for a reverse transfer degree is a simple and seamless process. Eligible individuals need to "opt in" and grant the four-year college or university permission to share their grade transcripts with the two-year college they attended.
