Access Missouri 6 CSR 10-2.150	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Changed official name of rule from Student Eligibility and Application Procedures to Access Missouri Financial Assistance Program • Added A+ reduction to award amount • Moved 2.5 CGPA requirement from renewal eligibility criteria to the definition of satisfactory academic progress for consistency with other rules. Renewal eligibility criteria now references satisfactory academic progress.
Bright Flight 6 CSR 10-2.080	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strengthened deferment procedures <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Rearranged language for clarity ○ Specified deferment must be requested before change in status ○ Referenced statute for deferment length instead of specifying 27 continuous months in event statute is changed • Added consortium agreement language consistent with Access Missouri • Clarified procedures for determining qualifying scores <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Based on the Missouri high school senior score report provided by ACT or College Board • Added accommodations for 2010-2011 changes • Revised to reflect paperless application process • Removed exclusion of correspondence-type courses in definition of full-time student <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Reflects changes in educational opportunities available to students ○ Undefined term included to address a problem that no longer exists

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Institutional Eligibility 6 CSR 10-2.140	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replaced references to “Access Missouri” with “state student assistance programs.” • Redefined “Educational-related Expenses” to distinguish them from other expenses to accommodate tuition-grant programs. • Added record retention requirement. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Same period required for compliance with federal Title IV programs. • Added requirement that institutions sign participation agreements for all programs in which they will participate. • Clarified the eligibility verification process <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Delivery not more than 10 business days after eligibility verification or eligibility must be reconfirmed before delivery. ○ Added requirement to collect affirmative proof of citizenship, permanent residency or lawful presence in the U.S. (Students who are citizens or permanent residents only have to provide proof before they receive their first award. Other students must provide proof annually.) • Added over award scenario to return of fund requirements • Clarified refund requirement when withdrawal occurs during the refund period <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Clarified language only; no new requirements.

Public Safety Officer Survivor 6 CSR 10-2.100	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clarified loss of eligibility when permanent/total disability resolved • Specified disbursements are semester-based
Vietnam Veteran’s Survivors 6 CSR 10-2.130	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clarified the requirements for medical certification. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Missouri state veteran’s service officer must certify that a Veteran’s Administration (VA) medical authority has certified the veteran’s death was a result of exposure to toxic chemicals; changed from qualified certification by a VA medical authority. • Clarified loss of eligibility for child applicants over 25 and spouses at 5th year anniversary of death. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Moved from end of rule to be included with other length of renewal benchmarks (a baccalaureate degree, completion of 150 credit hours or 10 semesters, whichever comes first) • Specified disbursements are semester-based.

<p>Determination of Student Residency 6 CSR 10-3.010</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Proposed addition of definitions of dependent and independent student to address financial aid aspect of the rule and ensure consistency with federal Title IV provisions.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Current definitions of adult, emancipated minor and unemancipated minor conflict with the federal Title IV aid dependency threshold of age 24.○ Definitions of adult, emancipated minor and unemancipated minor remain for determination of eligibility for in-state tuition○ Language clarified throughout to distinguish when each classification applies.● Proposed addition of definition of continuous enrollment.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ At least one credit or clock hour or the equivalent in at least one semester, excluding summer terms, each year.○ Primarily impacts unemancipated or dependent students whose parents cease to be Missouri residents after the student has established residency.● Proposed addition of language addressing when a student loses resident status.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ For adult, emancipated minor or independent students:<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ 12 months after establishing a domicile outside of Missouri○ For unemancipated minor or dependent students:<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ 12 months after those having legal custody of the student establish a domicile outside of Missouri, OR▪ If those having legal custody establish domicile outside of Missouri more than 12 consecutive months before the student's first enrollment at a postsecondary institution
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
