College Students

- ✓ Are you making some money this summer? If so, set aside a portion of your earnings to help you with expenses for next semester.
- ✓ It's not too late to get a summer internship or gain some volunteer experience. Use your extra time to learn more about your future career and build your resume.
- ✓ Make sure you've turned in any required paperwork to qualify for renewable scholarships. Likewise, if you haven't filed the 2017-18 FAFSA, do so ASAP. You don't want to miss out on free money.

Parents

- ✓ Make sure your graduated seniors are all set for their first semester of college. Encourage them to stay organized with orientation, registration, and housing information.
