REPORT: AP 17-18:08

The School of Health Sciences is proposing adoption of a new degree to replace the B.S. of Health Sciences – Business / Life-Health Science degree. The new degree will provide more value to the student and better prepare the student for a wide-range of nonclinical and administrative career opportunities in healthcare. The new degree is a B.S. in Healthcare Administration

The U.S Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics Employment Projections, project job growth of all occupations from 2014 to 2024 at 6.5%. Within this projection, growth of "Managerial Occupations" is projected at 5.5%. However, within this managerial category, job growth of "Medical and Health Services Managers" is projected at 16.9%.

The new degree, B.S. in Healthcare Administration will require 120 credit hours for graduation. The curriculum is intentional and focused on preparing the graduate for a successful career in healthcare business and administration. It combines a strong liberal arts general education with specific education in the areas of Health Sciences, General Business, Management, and Healthcare Leadership. The curriculum will prepare graduates for entry-level management positons in healthcare business and/or, successful matriculation to post-graduate Healthcare Administration and Business Administration—Healthcare Emphasis degree programs.

Please see the attached Mission, Vision, Values, Objectives, and Outcome Measurements for the B.S. in Healthcare Administration degree program.

The proposed Healthcare Administration degree curriculum includes 33 credit hours of Health Science courses and includes an internship. It includes 21 credit hours of Business courses and 9 credit hours in Management. It also includes and opportunity for 'independent study – research', and the opportunity for a 'Healthstream Summer Internship' in Nashville, TN.

There will be an 'Advisory Board' associated with this degree to engage leaders from the regional healthcare community and assure the goals and direction of the degree are aligned with and meeting the needs of the healthcare community.

In addition, this 'Healthcare Administration' program will obtain "Associate Program Membership" in the Association of University Programs in Healthcare Administration (AUPHA) with initial offering of the degree and, seek "Certification and Full Certified Program Membership" in AUPHA upon graduation of its first cohort. This certification is the "Gold Standard" for healthcare administration programs. There are currently only 46 undergraduate healthcare administration programs in the U.S. holding this certification (none in Missouri,

Kansas, Oklahoma, or Arkansas – only 3 in the eight state "Lion Pride Tuition area: Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, Ill., Tennessee State University in Nashville, TN, and Texas State University in San Marcos, TX.).
