Maximum number of students admitted is estimated at 25. If 25 are projected for the first year, then the second year will consist of 25 first year students and 25 second year students to equal 50 for total students. Program does not intend to have a part time tract.

Provide a rationale for proposing this program, including evidence of market demand and societal need supported by research:

Based on O'NET, psychiatric technicians and aids are projected to grow 5-8%, about as fast as the average for all occupations. In Missouri, the estimate is a 1 % growth in new positions. Missouri Economic Research and Information Center (MERIC) estimated substantial sh01iages accounting for the above average turnover rate in Missouri in direct care positions (42%), resulting in 664 new job openings. These projections are through 2022, DMH reports that in their psychiatric hospitals, this results in an average of more than 21 hours of overtime per month per direct care staff member. O'NET projects a median wage of \$31,140. The median wages are projected to be \$26,430 for Missouri. However, the partnership with DMH anticipates that reimbursement rates will be equal to that of bachelor's degree technicians or approximately \$23,660-29,640 (MO Coalition Survey).

Students will go through a selective admission process including personal interview and three references: potential to function within the healthcare field, work performance and academic performance. This will assist students in understanding of the demands of the program and the mental health field. This will also ensure students do not have obstacles for later employment, as employers have requested drug testing and background checks to be a part of the program. Students will complete general coursework with a "C" or better and maintain a 2.5 GPA in order to graduate.
