Special Admissions Procedure or Student Qualifications required:

All admissions procedures are consistent with those used for other bachelor's degree programs at Truman. This particular program focuses on degree completion. Consequently, participating students are already students at Truman and are switching programs to respond to life circumstances that prevent completing another major on campus.

Specific Population Characteristics to be served:

This program is aimed at students who, because of life circumstances, can no longer complete an onground program at Truman State University and must complete the requirements for their degree from a distance. Such a program serves the interests of students who may be at risk for not completing their degree, those who have family interests that keep them away from Kirksville, or those who need to seek employment elsewhere for economic reasons.

Faculty Characteristics

Special Requirements for Assignment of Teaching for this Degree/Certificate:

The faculty characteristics do not differ from those of regular Truman faculty as the coursework (with the exception of the capstone) is drawn from existing coursework that is part of other majors and the existing core curriculum.

Estimate Percentage of Credit Hours that will be assigned to full time faculty:

The proportion of full-time and part-time faculty committed to this program will mirror that of the University as a whole because the coursework draws from offerings already scheduled by the University. Students will enroll in online sections of courses already offered on campus.

Expectations for professional activities, special student contact, teaching/learning innovation: Faculty will be primarily responsible for student teaching, advising, and supervision. The professional advisors in the Center for Academic Excellence will further support the faculty in their advising because the degree aims to assist with retention and completion. Because the University will be offering courses entirely online, faculty will be expected to engage in a regular cycle of course "refresh" activities to keep content current.

- Students must complete INDV 4XX Liberal Studies Capstone: Senior Assignment. A student may request to substitute a major-specific capstone course with the approval of their advisor, the chair of the department, and the Director of Retention and Student Success.

- Students may earn minors as part of their degree, but the minors may not count toward the
 fulfillment of the required Liberal Studies major credits or the required concentration within the

Bachelor of Science in Liberal Studies (BS)

The Bachelor of Science in Liberal Studies degree serves the needs of students who, upon attaining at least 60 credit hours of coursework, wish to pursue a less-structured program of learning on a specific topic of interest. The degree retains the full benefits of the University's Dialogues curriculum, including its coursework in communication, history and social sciences, natural sciences and mathematics, the arts and humanities, statistics, and more. With all core degree requirements offered online, the degree facilitates timely completion of degrees started on-ground at Truman or other institutions and prepares students for entry into productive and fulfilling careers. In lieu of a formal major, students graduate with a Bachelor's degree in Liberal Studies with a concentration in their chosen area of focus.

Students pursuing the bachelor's degree, upon completion of their program, in addition to fulfilling the objectives of the general education curriculum, will be able to:

- Articulate and demonstrate the interconnectedness of knowledge and academic disciplines;
- Describe and summarize the strengths and limitations of different approaches to thinking, particularly those that blossom from disciplines relevant to their concentration;
- Apply acquired knowledge to experiences beyond the classroom;
- Explain the purpose and and benefits of a liberal arts education;
- Formulate and defend a justification of the importance and significance of linkages between selected coursework for the fulfillment of intended career goals;
- Explain the value of lifelong learning and articulate plans or aspirations for learning goals after graduation;
- Create a portfolio of artifacts that demonstrate preparation for future career and educational paths as engaged citizens.

Any student who enrolls at Truman is eligible for admission to the Liberal Studies major, but must meet the following minimum requirements:

- Has earned at least 60 credit hours before applying to the program, and has a minimum of three semesters (excluding summer) of undergraduate study at Truman
- Has proposed a plan of work in consultation with an advisor, which shall be approved by the Director of Retention and Student Success.

Applying to enroll in this degree program will necessitate a change of catalogs. All Liberal Studies Program coursework will be applied to the new Dialogues curriculum. Truman Week
