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I. Introduction

In accordance with Missouri statute 178.820, St. Louis Community College formed a redistricting committee charged with using the 2010 census information to redistrict the College's elected board of trustees. The committee recognized that any redistricting plan for the St. Louis Community College District must abide by the following statutory requirements:

- Given that the District has more than 450,000 people, there shall not be less than four, nor more than six subdistricts.
- "In any district which shall contain a city not within a county, if four subdistricts are established, then at least one subdistrict shall be within said city, and if five or six subdistricts are established then at least two subdistricts shall be within said city" (Missouri Statute 178.820, subsection 3). This language applies to the St. Louis Community College District and St. Louis City.
- There shall be six trustees elected to represent the people of the St. Louis Community College District.
- In accordance with the constitutional principle of one-man, one-vote, the population of any subdistrict divided by the number trustees in that subdistrict shall be substantially equal to the population of any other subdistrict divided by the number of trustees in that subdistrict.
- The redistricting committee may submit a plan that uses one of three options.
 - A. All trustees to be elected from subdistricts
 - B. One or more trustees elected at-large and the remainder elected from subdistricts.
 - C. All trustees elected at-large.

Regardless of the option, each trustee must live in a certain sub-district and the principle of one-man, one-vote must be maintained.

II. Population Background

1. There are 1,358,158 people (Census data, 2010) in the St. Louis Community College District. The District contains St. Louis City, St. Louis County, and small portions of Jefferson and Franklin Counties. The District encompasses approximately 700 square miles. The citizens of the St. Louis Community College District elect six trustees to represent their interests. Therefore, the mean population per trustee is 226,360.

III. Community Input

On September 8, 2011, the Committee held a public hearing to solicit comments from the public related to the College's redistricting process. The public hearing was held on the College's Meramec campus at 6 p.m. Although the public hearing was widely publicized in St. Louis area newspapers, no one from the public attended the hearing.

IV. Committee Deliberations

The committee met three times to discuss and review options related to the redistricting process. (A complete set of minutes from the meetings is included in this report. At its first meeting, the committee elected officers and reviewed materials from the 2001 redistricting plan. During the review the committee recognized that Missouri statute 178.802(3), when viewed in concert with the population loss in the City of St. Louis (a decline of 8.3% from 2000 to 2010) forced the committee to consider options related to a four-sub-district configuration.

V. The Proposed Plan

Sub-district 2 and Sub-district 3 Census Tract Boundaries For 2010

These boundaries describe the southern edge of Sub-district 2 and the northern edge of Sub-district 3.

From the intersection of the City limits and Dale Avenue, proceed east on Dale to the intersection of Dale and Manchester. At the intersection of Dale and Manchester, continue east on Manchester to the intersection of Manchester and Sublette.

At the intersection of Manchester and Sublette, turn south and continue on Sublette to Wilson. At the intersection of Sublette and Wilson, turn west onto Wilson. Continue on Wilson to the intersection of Wilson and January. At the intersection of Wilson and January, turn south and continue on January to the intersection of January and Fyler.

At the intersection of January and Fyler, turn east on Fyler and continue on Fyler to the intersection of Fyler and Kingshighway. At the intersection of Kingshighway and Fyler, turn south on Kingshighway. Continue on Kingshighway to the intersection of Kingshighway and Chippewa.

At the intersection of Kingshighway and Chippewa, turn east onto Chippewa. Continue on Chippewa to the intersection of Chippewa and Morganford. At the intersection of Chippewa and Morganford, turn south on Morganford. Continue on Morganford to the intersection of Morganford and Delor.

At the intersection of Morganford and Delor, turn east on Delor. Continue on Delor to the intersection of Delor and Grand. At the intersection of Delor and Grand, turn north on Grand and continue to the intersection of Grand and Meramec. At the intersection of Grand and

Meramec, turn west on Meramec. Continue on Meramec to the intersection of Meramec and Gustine.

At the intersection of Meramec and Gustine, turn north and proceed on Gustine to Alberta. At Alberta turn east and continue on Alberta to Grand. At Grand, turn south and continue on Grand to Osage. Turn east on Osage and continue on Osage to Interstate 55. Follow Interstate 55 south to Gasconade. At Gasconade turn east and follow Gasconade to the Mississippi River.

MINUTES St. Louis Community College Redistricting Committee Meeting #1 August 9, 2011

A meeting of the St. Louis Community College Redistricting Committee was held on August 9, 2011, pursuant to notice and in accordance with Missouri State Statute 178.820. 4. City census tracts 1042, 1045, 1135, 1272, 1152 and 1153 will move from Sub-district 3 into Sub-district 2.

The results of proposed plan will be as follows:

Sub-district 2	228,158
Sub-district 3	225,125
Sub-district 4	454,461

The number of people represented by each trustee ranges from a low of 225,207(Sub-district 1) to a high of 228,158 (Sub-district 2).

The number of people represented by each trustee will increase from 225,125 (Sub-district 1) to a high of 228,158 (Sub-district 2).
