



State Appropriations and Student Fees as Percentage of Total Revenues

¹ EFC or Expected Family Contribution is the amount of money a student's family is expected to contribute to college costs for one year. It is used as a measure of a family's financial strength and takes into account factors such as the family's taxed and untaxed income, assets, benefits and family size. Students with the lowest EFC's have the greatest need.

² Average income is the income averages for 0809, 0910, and 1011 and is based off of Southeast's FISAP income information based on a family size of four and one in college.

³ A 12,000 EFC represents an average household income of \$79,537 based on the same three years, FISAP income and family size/number in college as listed above. This EFC is the cut-off in determining eligibility under the state, need-based Access Missouri Program.

⁴ Approximately 100 students with an EFC of \$99,999 annually receive A+ funding. Maximum income with an EFC of \$99,999 can exceed \$1,000,000.
