- St. Louis Community College at Wildwood has seen enrollment grow since its inception in fall 2007 to now, spring 2011 headcount has reached 2063. 25% of all students who take courses on the Wildwood campus are in classes on multiple campuses.
- Beyond the number of students enrolled on the Wildwood campus, the offering of the AFA at this location would enhance the enrollment and graduation rate of the entire district and would allow students in the Wildwood area to focus their studies on the campus closest to them.
- As the campus expands into phase two of our campus, we predict serving an additional 1500 students at this location.
- Currently, on the Wildwood campus we have students taking courses applicable to the AFA degree. Enrollment in these courses applicable to the AFA Program is at 184, not including Art Appreciation classes.

Overview:

St. Louis Community College has 15 college transfer options and over 100 career programs. The mission states St. Louis Community College expands minds and changes lives every day. We create accessible, dynamic learning environments focused on the needs of our diverse communities.

In AY 09-10 and 10-11 the Visual and Performing Arts on the Wildwood campus saw an 83% increase in enrollment. In response to this increase in interest a space (the Art Annex) was rented near campus. A three year lease was agreed upon with the owner of a nearby property for the cost of \$20,000 per year as indicated in form FP.

STLCC Wildwood is attracting student who are pursuing the Associates Degree in General Transfer studies, Business Administration and Teaching. Students not seeking a degree at STLCC Wildwood are taking classes that will transfer to a four year institution including those that would be applicable to the AFA/BFA agreement.

Student Preparation

There are no special admission procedures or student qualifications required for program which exceed regular admissions standards.

The Associates in Fine Arts is not directed or focused on any specific demographic population.

Faculty Characteristics

All full and part time faculty members within this program are highly trained in the areas of Visual Arts and also have professional connections in the Visual Arts Industry. The Wildwood faculty stay current with up to date equipment, software and hardware. Each maintains a Master's Degree or higher from an accredited institution often with the Masters in Fine Arts terminal degree in the field. All part time faculty members are managed by the Chair to assure high academic integrity and adherence to program and course learning outcomes.

Enrollment Projections

It is estimated that by the end of five years the number of FTE majoring in the program will be over fifty students district wide. We believe we will see a 25% increase in full and

part time enrollment in the Wildwood campus over the next five years. Some of these students will be perusing the AFA degree.

Student and Program Outcomes

Due to our agreement with UMSL, STLCC transfer rates from the four campuses to that specific institution is measurable and will be a part of the continuous assessment of the program.

Program Accreditation

St. Louis Community College District holds HLC accreditation for the district including the Wildwood campus. There are no plans to aggressively seek further certifications or accreditations from an outside accrediting body.

Alumni and Employer Survey

Alumni satisfaction and success assessment will be developed as a part of the Wildwood campus assessment projects for the Visual and Performing Arts Department.
